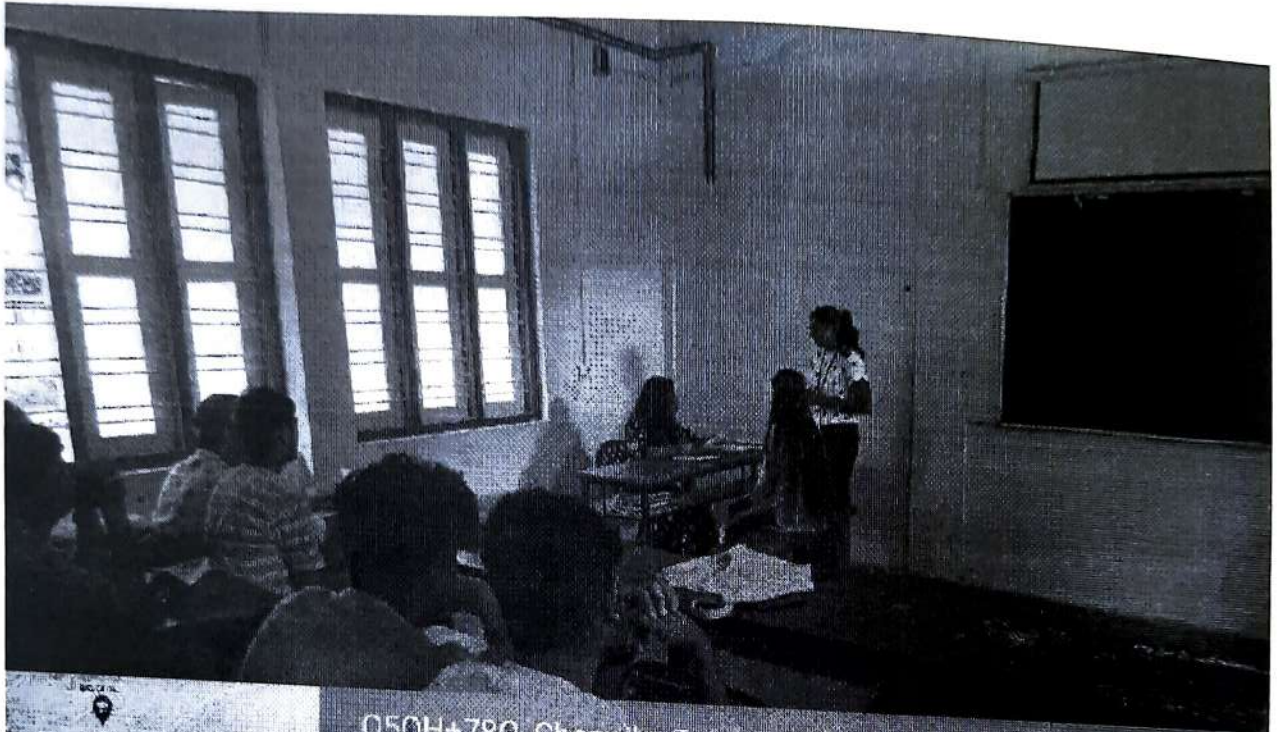

- **Third Prize:** Faris Rahman M T

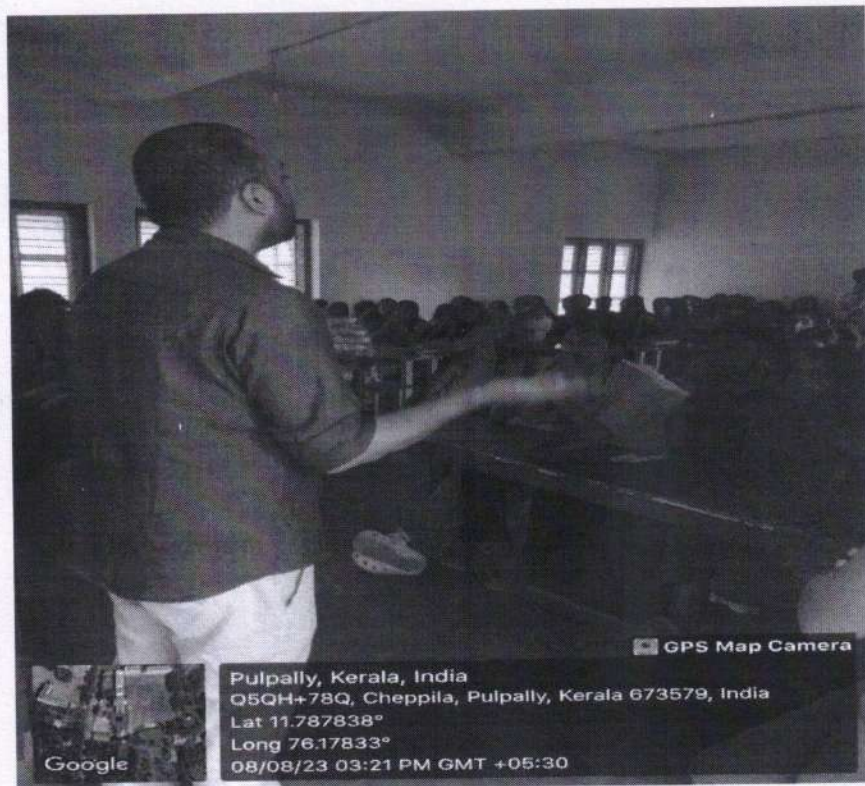
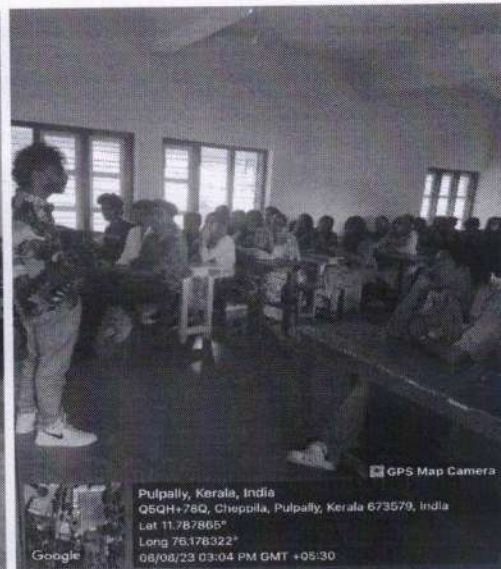
Each of these students demonstrated exceptional understanding and articulation of their respective positions, earning them well-deserved recognition.

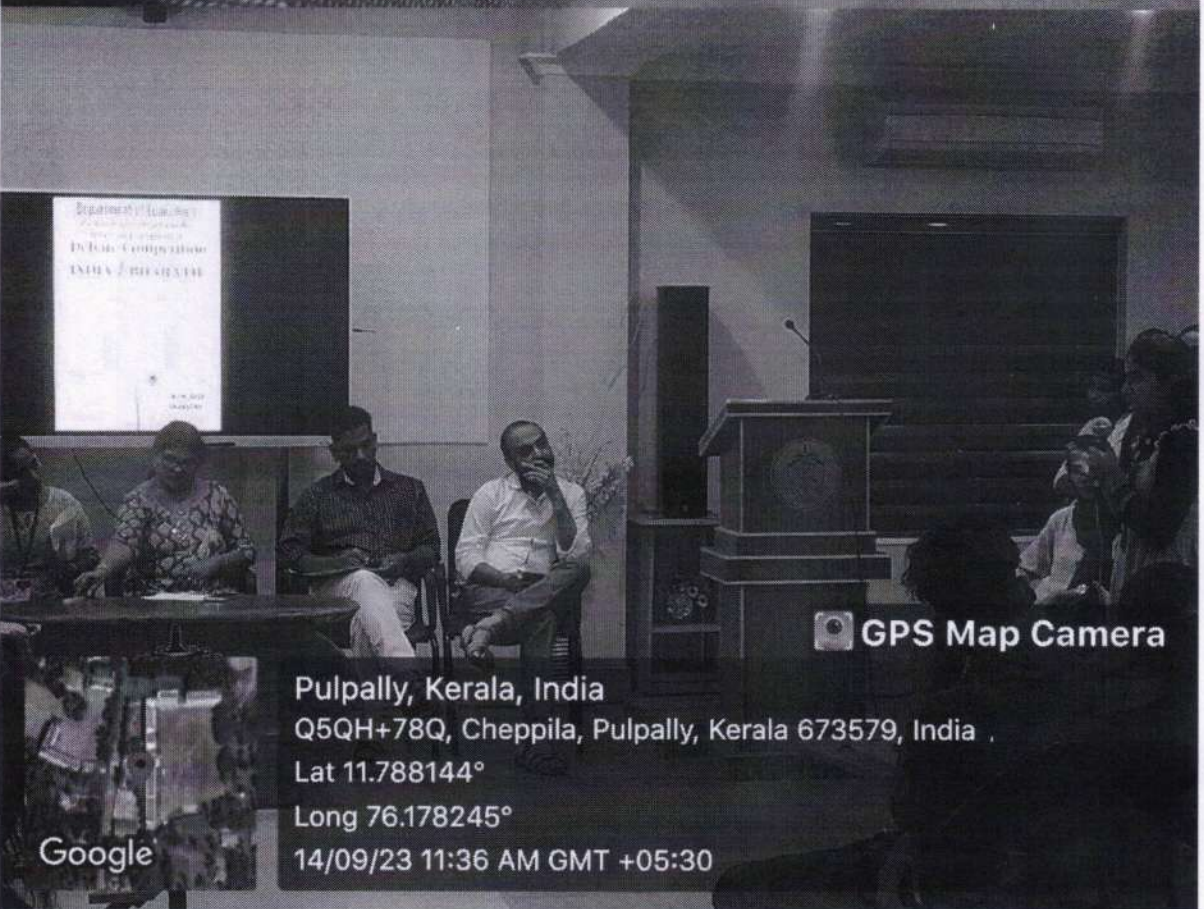

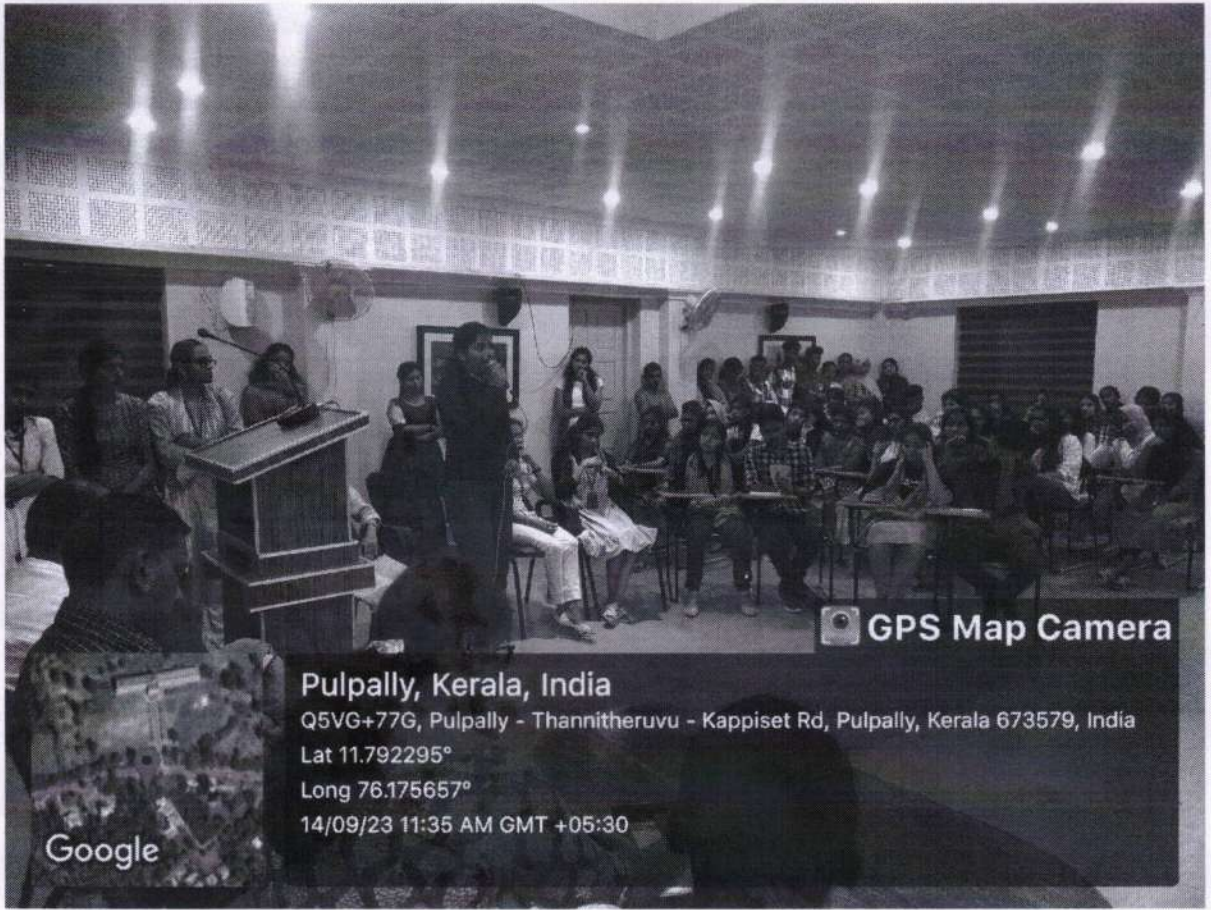

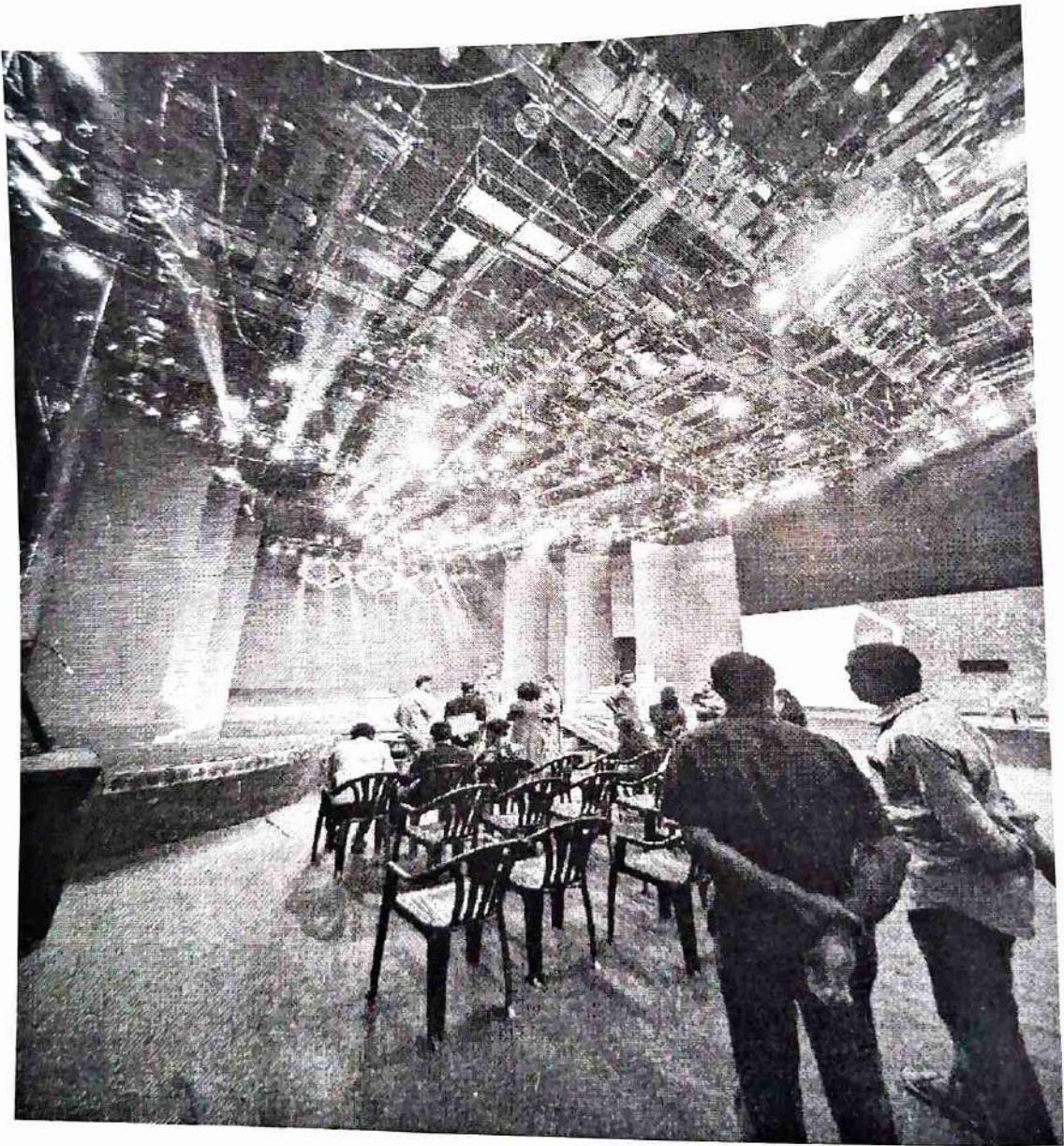

In conclusion, both the channel and newspaper visits provided valuable perspectives on modern media practices and opportunities for future engagement and collaboration.

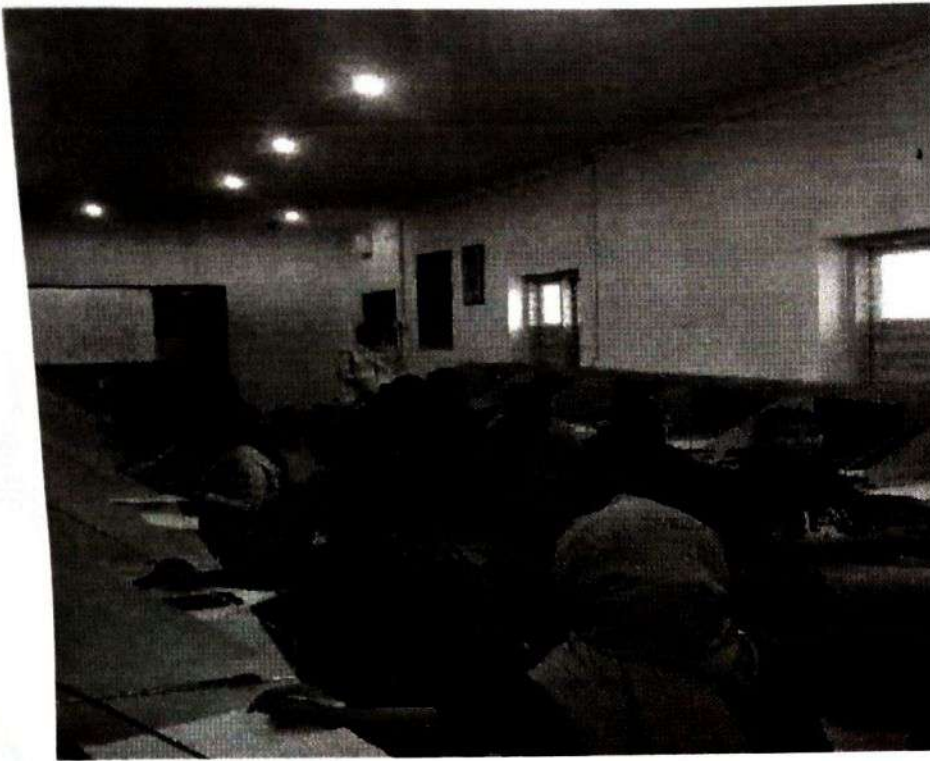

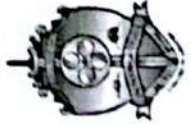
Outcomes of the Debate

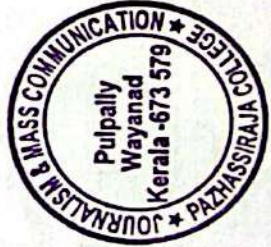

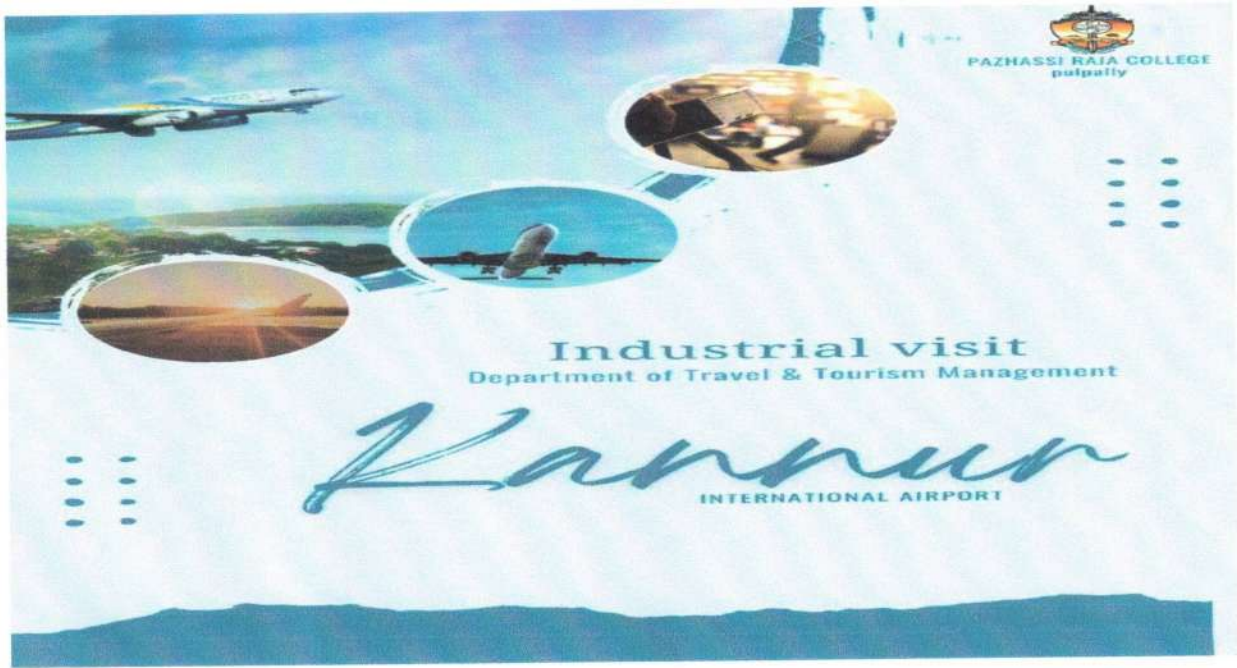
Recommendations:
