SOCIAL PROGRAMMES

Participatory community upliftment programme, together with 'Shreyas'

The College has been associating with SHREYAS, one of the largest social service organizations in the region. It is the official social development organization of the Malankara Catholic Diocese of Bathery, which is the management of the college as well. Their activities primarily focus on the upliftment of the poor and marginalized societies. We, through a group of selected students, regularly engage in a number of activities of Shreyas and the major of them are following.

SNEHA SPARSHAM: This is a seminar series organized in association with Shrevas on the significance of financial savings by women. The main aim of this seminar was to create awareness among women belonging to the tribal and other socially backward sections of the society. The daily life of those backward societies based on the wages received daily and the aim of the prgrame is basically to uplift them to start bank accounts, engage in regular saving schemes like Recurring Deposits, postal schemes, etc.

'NAAM ONNU': This is a unique orientation/seminar/interface programme aimed at sensitizing the people about the need for gender equity. Apart from organizing orientation or semianrs, the college team, in association with Shreyas visits adopted colonies and interact with them to raise awareness on the matter

'NALEYKAY'- The district is facing drinking water crisis severely. The growing climate change contributes into the water crisis issue. Realising the importance of it, the college takes part with Shreyas in engaging on environmental and water conservation activities. A large scale water conservation program in a canal near Pulpally. Check dams were constructed in canals to preserve water. There was the active participation of students as well as members of Shreyas and local residencts.

'SANTWANAM': The tribal colonies face a number of health issues and many a times, they, due to lack of awareness, do not realize the issues they face. Understanding the need, Shreyas engage in organizing medical camps within colonies and the college team takes part in it as well. The latest of such a programme, which was held at Mullankolly tribal colony, was participated by 120 participants. The primary focus was to discuss on the health issues they face and provided an opportunity for checking their blood sugar, cholesterol, and blood pressure. A blood group detection session was also there. The camp could detect three people with Sickle Cell Anemia disease as well.

'KARUTHAL': Tribal student interaction by the students of the college and school level students are organized with the intention to stimulate interest among the school level students of the colonies to go up in the higher education level. Along with it, programmes are organized with the same intention. The most recent one was an orientation programme which was done at Kappiset tribal colony. Thirty three students have participated in the class. Dr. Dileep M R, IQAC coordinator of the college and Mr. Shanson, Regional director of Shreyas led the class in the programme.



Campus Cleaning

NSS Volunteers actively involved in the Campus cleaning on 26-09-19. Every Wednesday and Friday the NSS volunteers in every class led a class cleaning activity and that is a regularized programme in the college initiated by the NSS units.
